Job profile

This job is part of the project Altergrowth funded by the *Agence Nationale de la Recherche* (ANR) for the 2015-2018 period. The project is coordinated by Vincent Béal (Univ. of Strasbourg) and it is implemented by a team of researchers coming from different disciplinary backgrounds: sociology, urban planning, political science, geography and demography. The project analyses the issue of urban shrinkage in comparative perspectives. Through a combination of quantitative analysis and local case studies, it intends to understand how French, German and American cities address the issue of demographic and economic decline. - To assist the project coordinator in the management and the coordination of the project
- To conduct fieldwork in Germany (literature review/state of the art, interviews with local and national actors, collection of quantitative data, etc.)

- An expertise in the field of urban studies reflected by the publication of articles in refereed journals
- A background in qualitative research methods (a basic knowledge of quantitative methods would be a plus)
- Strong written and oral skills in French or English + oral and reading proficiency in German
- An ability to work independently as well as part of a team
